


The planet Sentari was like a well-oiled machine.


Everything was planned

and scheduled.




Each person had his job and did it efficiently, arriving on time, taking a precise meal break, and leaving exactly as the tone sounded for the end of the work day.




The trains and buses and spaceships ran on time and never broke down.



Time away from work was spent learning, taking care of their possessions, and resting for the next day.








The routine went on every day, three days a week (for Sentari was a very small planet and had only a three-day week).

They were very content.


And yet they sensed that something was missing . . .








Alpha, Beta and Gamma shared a dwelling in a city in the northern part of Sentari.



They were typical Sentarians, but a happy accident led them to fame.


One day, due to a miscalculation, which was practically unknown on Sentari, Alpha walked right into Beta, almost knocking him off his feet.



He caught Beta under the arms to keep him from falling. Instantly, a warm glow spread over the two beings, and they felt something they had never felt before.




They jumped back and looked at each other, trying to figure out what it was they had felt. Being very clever beings, they soon saw that the way they had held each other was different from anything they had ever done before.







Now they knew it was no accident. They continued to try it in twos and threes, and the same thing happened every time.








They knew that they had found something special and began to spread the word among their friends and co-workers. The hug spread like wildfire!

The trains and buses weren't always on time, and sometimes things broke down.










This was unusual for Sentari, and the people began to panic.








But Sentari's leader was a wise old being. He had foreseen that this would happen and calmed his frightened people.


quite pleased with their huntion and are eager to share it with the rock of the planet.




